Course Description

In marked contrast to many psychoanalytic theories, attachment theory, as developed by John Bowlby and Mary Ainsworth, is grounded in observational research. It is a coherent, consistent theory that now has influenced much of current psychodynamic thinking. What attachment theories point to has been called the bedrock from which other psychodynamic theories spring.

Standing behind developmental and relational difficulties in many of our clients' lives are experiences of chronic emotional misattunement, neglect, or abuse. These experiences form the
